

The following are good websites that are free to use. They have assessment features and alter questions based on ability. We have stated which year groups each website is best suited for.

### **Read Theory (Years 2-6)**

Setting up a Read Theory account is free, all you need is an email address.

The children log into Read Theory and are given a comprehension. The comprehension has multiple choice questions. If the children get the question wrong, they will be told why it is wrong.

The children's comprehensions have a Grade. These can be worked out as English year groups by adding 1, so Grade 5 is the same as Year 6.

When a child gets between 70% and 89% they will stay on the same Grade.

If they get less than 70% they will move down a Grade.

If they get over 89% they will move up a grade.

A good score for children to get on a Read Theory is 75%.

### **Sumdog (Years 2-6)**



Setting up a Sumdog account is free, all you need is an email address. There is a free app 'Sumdog' or the website is [www.sumdog.com](http://www.sumdog.com).

When the children log in they have six maths games to choose from.

These games will give them the type of maths they need to work on.

Children can earn coins for right answers in order to buy things for their house or accessories for their character.

### **Prodigy Game (Years 4-6)**



Setting up a Prodigy Game account is free, all you need is an email address. Log in through the website [www.prodigygame.com](http://www.prodigygame.com) and press 'play prodigy'.

The children have a pet (like Pokemon) and go on missions to find stolen crystals. Along the way the children have to answer maths questions. The game gives the children the type of maths they need to work.
