| primary colours | | Primary colours are three key colours - Red, Blue and Yellow. They cannot be made from any other colour. |
| colour mixing | red + white | Making new colours from existing colours. |
| secondary colours | If you mix equal amounts of the primary colours, you get the Secondary colours - Purple, Green and Orange. | |
| | Red + Yellow = Orange Red + Blue = Purple Blue + Yellow = Green | |
| warm colours | \$ 100 P | The top half of the colours are 'warm' or 'hot' and the ones on the bottom are 'cool' or 'cold'. |
